Mission

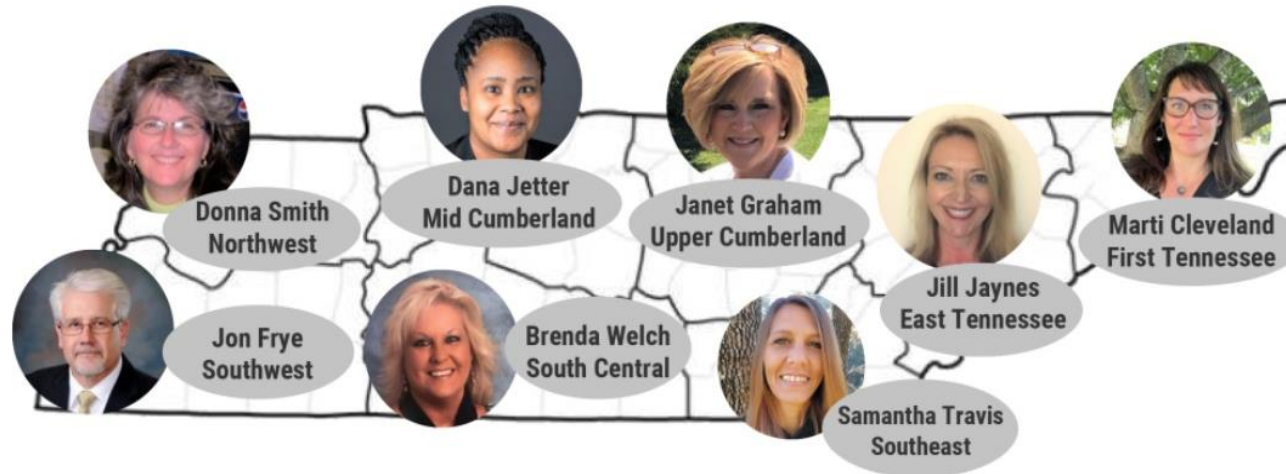
- Give every public TN high school student the opportunity to take free and online Advanced Placement classes for college credit.



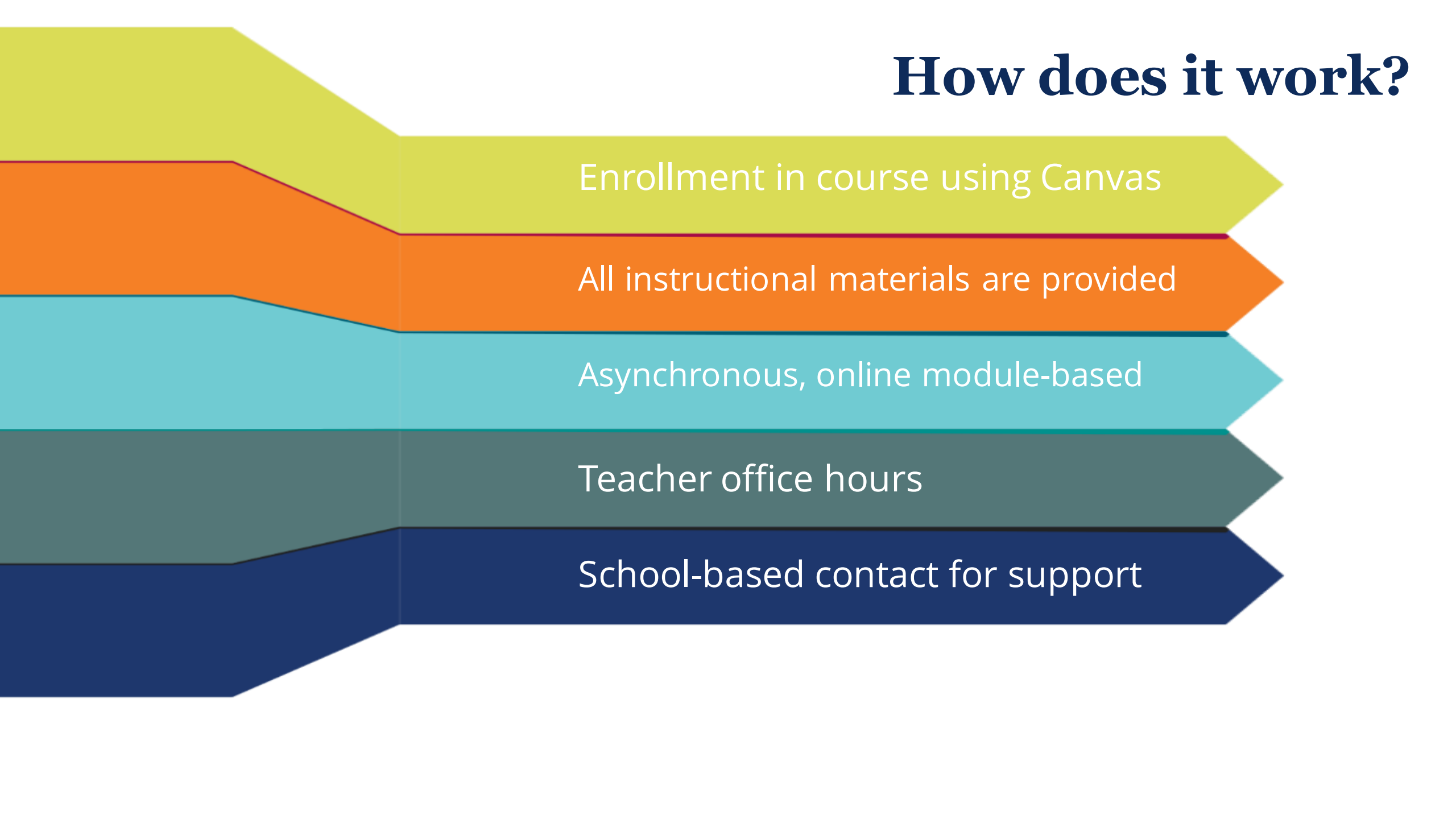

Serving Students

- Over 1,800 students are taking 15 different AP courses in the program's first year
- Increasing course options to 18 different AP courses this fall.
- 109 Tennessee school systems, representing 192 schools, are participating in the program. This is 88% of all public-school systems in the state.
 - The average number of course offerings increased by 63% after high schools begin participating in APAA

Serving Teachers

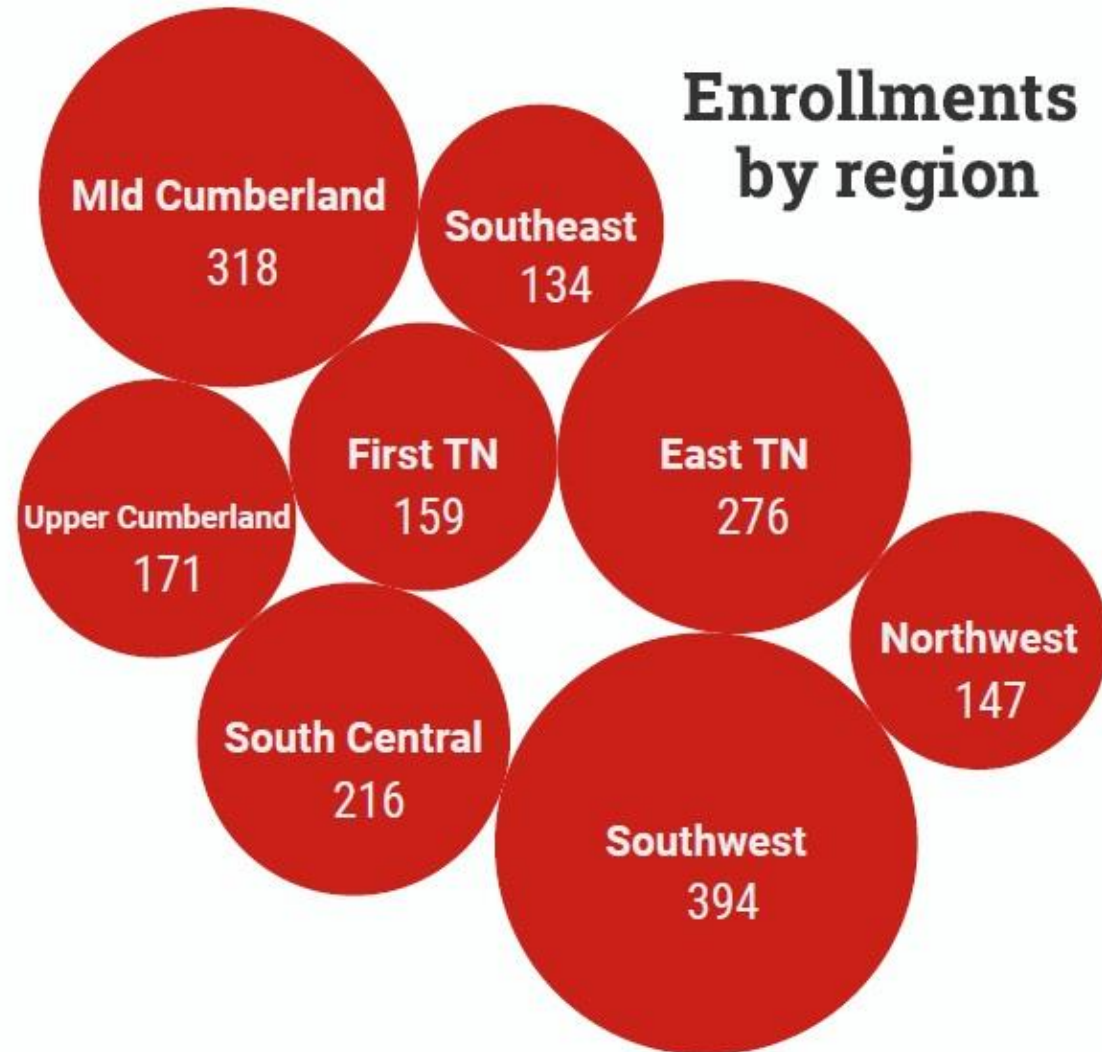
- APAA offers teachers the opportunity to complete AP College Board certification for free.
 - This summer 600 teachers are expected to be trained.
- APAA also will be awarding mini-grants for AP teachers to purchase needed supplies, textbooks, and software for their students.
 - Expect to award approximately 50 awards of \$500 each

District Recruitment



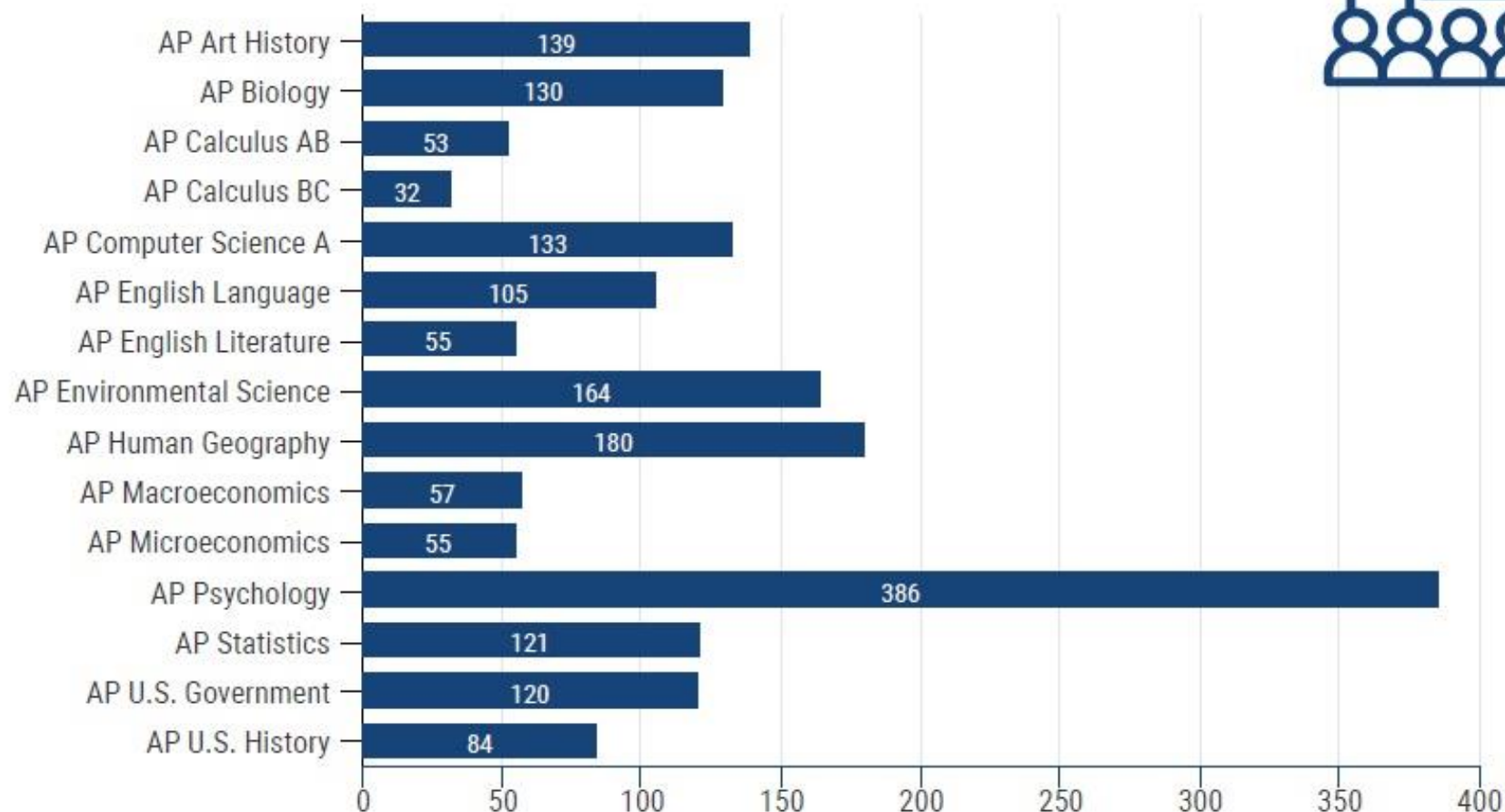
Enrollment Snapshot

"My AP psychology class does not feel like an online course at all. There is amazing use of hands on and engaging material that connects students from all across the state."

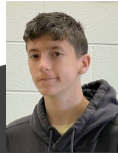
